

**NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH EXTINGUISHMENT AND
DEFINITIVE MAP AND STATEMENT MODIFICATION ORDER**

**HIGHWAYS ACT 1980
WILDLIFE AND COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1981**

**THE SHROPSHIRE COUNCIL PARISH OF HIGHLEY, FOOTPATH 37 (PART)
PUBLIC PATH EXTINGUISHMENT ORDER 2026.**

The above-named order made on 29th January 2026, by the Shropshire Council (“the Council”) under section 118 of the Highways Act 1980 and section 53A(2) of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981, will **extinguish**

The full width of that part of the Footpath 37 from Point **A** on the Order map at grid reference SO 7380 8358 running along a fenced in alleyway, through a pedestrian gate and along the field edge to Point **B** on the Order map at grid reference SO 7392 8341. A total distance of approximately 240 metres in length.

Please state the grounds on which they are made.

If no such representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Council may confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is sent to the Secretary of State for the Environment, Food and Rural Affairs for confirmation any representations and objections which have not been withdrawn will be sent with the Order.
